





The Evolution of HIV Prevention in the US

The first U.S. cases of what would become known as AIDS-defining illness were documented nearly 35 years ago. The advent and regulatory approval in the mid-1990s of combination antiretroviral therapy to treat HIV transformed what was once a certain death sentence into a manageable chronic illness. Extended survival for many persons following initial HIV diagnosis has led to increased HIV prevalence worldwide, and this changing landscape necessitates an evolution of approaches to HIV prevention. This presentation will highlight historical and contemporary approaches to HIV prevention in the U.S. A recently funded RCT that will test the efficacy of a behavioral approach to reduce HIV transmissions by older adults living with HIV will be discussed.
