Using Library Materials

Like most academic libraries, PSU Library has lots of services and materials for you:

- Check out any print journal for 3 days (bring the journal to the Circulation Desk).
- Check out books for 12 weeks with 3 renewals.
- Freely borrow books from other libraries and have them delivered to PSU for pickup.
- Use interlibrary loan to borrow materials not locally available.

Using the Library Building

We've got lots of stuff in the building to help you. Food and drinks are ok!

- Two computer labs, one on the 1st floor the other on the 2nd floor. Student lab workers can help on the 1st floor, while librarians are available on the 2nd.
- Borrow a laptop or iPad to use in the building.

Tips to Survive your First Year

Establish a System to Track Articles and Other Citations

If you establish this habit during your first year, you won't be scrambling when it comes time to research and write a literature review for your thesis or dissertation. Choose technology or paper: whatever works for you is great.

There are several technological tools that can help you with citation and pdf management. It might help to find out if profs and students in your department have any favorites.

- Zotero: a free software application, browser extension for Firefox, and web account which can sync with multiple computers. <u>zotero.org</u>
- Mendeley: a free software application, and web account which can sync with multiple computers. It also has a pdf component that allows you to save and annotate pdfs. <u>mendeley.com</u>
- EndNote: Not free. Purchase software and licenses from the PSU bookstore. Syncs with its freebie version, EndNote Web. <u>myendnoteweb.com</u>
- Papers: Not free. Software that manages pdfs and lets you search for others on the web. <u>www.mekentosj.com/papers</u>
