

FUNDING AVAILABLE FOR 2018-19 STUDENT PROJECTS

The Northwest Public Health Training Center at NWCPHP has funding to support student projects during the 2018–19 school year. Twenty proposals will be funded up to \$3,500 each.

ELIGIBILITY

Project work must be based in Washington, Alaska, Idaho, or Oregon. Stipends are available for:

- Graduate and doctoral students in public health, psychology, sociology, and social work degree programs.
- Undergraduate juniors or seniors enrolled in public health, psychology, sociology, and social work degree programs. Undergraduate applications must include a letter of support from a faculty member.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

Compile your application packet with the following information:

- Completed online application
- 1-2 page résumé or CV
- Project plan including methods, timeline of tasks, and deliverables
- Letter of support (for undergraduates only)

Students may apply for funding any time during fall or winter quarter of the 2018–19 school year. Proposals will be evaluated based on public health practice focus, attention to underserved areas and populations, and feasibility. Students are strongly encouraged to submit projects that address opioid misuse and improving mental and behavioral health.
