Kerri Smith Slingerland is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), Certified Drug and Alcohol Counselor (CADC-III) Masters of Healthcare Management and Certified Brain Injury Specialist (CBIS). Kerri provides services to vulnerable individuals experiencing health crisis, homelessness, and she has experience working in Indian Country. Kerri is a tribal citizen of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians.

Kerri has held leadership roles as a Director in program development, SAMHSA grant administration, supervision, systems improvement and quality improvement focused on health services administration, Transitional Care, Primary Behavioral Healthcare Integration, Trauma-Informed Care, and Health Literacy. Kerri is currently working at OHSU on the New Directions team with vulnerable individuals who have begun to use the Emergency Department frequently. At home Kerri spends a fair amount of time providing transportation to soccer, basketball, futsal and baseball for her two sons, Calder and Seau (Pronounced "So").
