We seek an individual with a commitment to sexual and reproductive health, rights, and justice, with a strong quantitative background and complete fluency in Spanish. The Project Manager will provide research support to the Free the Pill Campaign and the Oral Contraceptives Over-the-Counter Working Group to help build the case for making oral contraception available over the counter in the United States, and will also contribute to research focused on destignatizing abortion around the world, and understanding the safety and effectiveness of out-of-clinic models of abortion care. The Project Manager will work with multiple study teams on other new and ongoing research projects, potentially including our global work on later abortion care, access to abortion and contraception care for transgender and gender-expansive individuals. Areas of responsibility include, but are not limited to: management and oversight of ongoing research projects in the United States and Latin America, quantitative data management and analysis in English and Spanish, development of study instruments, management of institutional review board protocols, coordination of fieldwork, clear communication of research results in multiple formats, supporting development of grant proposals, organizing meetings, and more.

Qualifications & Requirements:

- Fluency in English and Spanish
- Excellent quantitative skills (including one or more years of training <u>and</u> one or more years of experience in quantitative data analysis and solid understanding of software packages such as Stata or R or other quantitative software)
- Master's degree in public health, public policy, or related discipline OR equivalent experience
- At least two years of substantive experience in research in the fields of public health, public policy, or related disciplines

- Excellent interpersonal, writing, and presentation skills in English and Spanish
- Ability to make and carry out decisions independently and a dedication to team building and collaboration
- Excellent managerial and organizational skills, including self-starter, detail-oriented, highly organized, and able to meet deadlines
- Willingness and ability to travel up to approximately 25% of time

Preferences:

- Exposure to qualitative research methods and software (MAXQDA, Dedoose, Atlas-ti, or other)
- Experience working on projects cross-culturally
- Research and/or project management experience in the fields of sexual and reproductive health
- Dedication to team building and staff development
