

Dear Colleagues,

As you know we are living through a difficult time and facing extraordinary circumstances, not just as an institution, but as a global community. The efforts we are all making now are designed to help us in the long run to lessen the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, and I understand how challenging this is for all of us.

With our proposed move to virtual classrooms, a group of us have been working very hard behind the scenes to put together key resources to make the transition easier for our faculty. At this stage, these resources support in-person didactic materiel, and do not currently provide support for substituting clinical or lab-based experiences – this is something we are working on.

Resources for faculty

To support OHSU faculty, a "<u>Transforming Teaching</u>" site has been created to provide concise, practical resources, and strategies for moving part or all of a course online. Assessment advice for teaching remotely

Consider assessments that will not require proctoring like essays, self-assessments, and untimed short answer exams. OHSU uses Examity for online live proctoring – the cost for each exam per exam taker is \$20 for a two-hour exam and \$35 for a four-hour exam. For more information, please see the interim guidelines for using Examity and watch this video that gives an overview. If you decide your assessment requires proctoring, contact the <u>TLC Help Desk</u> at least two weeks before the exam. Please note that any approved accommodations still need to be provided.
