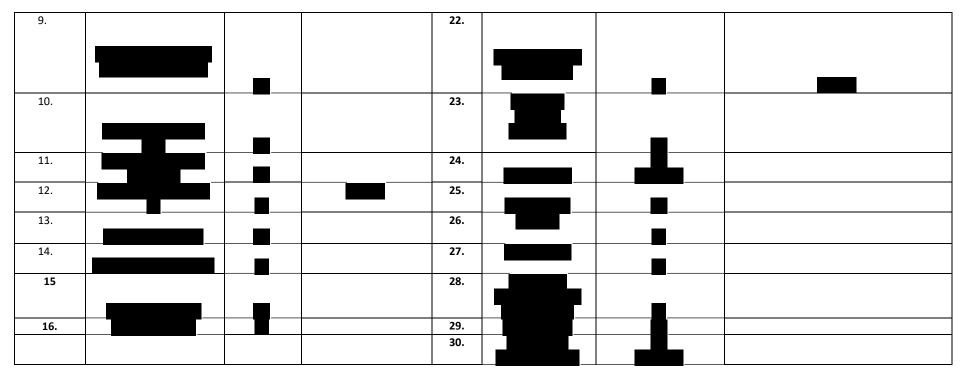

Proposed Program Changes	10- Yes; 3- Abstentions; 0- Disapprovals  UNI New Course —  submitted a curricular change request to add a new UNI course for Fall 2024. It is an introductory course on the complex topics related to data equity. Currently, this course already exists as a BSTA 504 course within SPH, but is proposing to make it a permanent course with a UNI designation instead of a SPH Biostats designation and have the course count as an IPE course for SPH students.  In oted that having it designated as a UNI course would allow the HIP students to participate.	Proposed UNI course was approved.

	provided some feedback specifically asking for a proposed replacement to the exam, not just an alternative.  The working group is working on this and will be sending the proposal back for them to review again.

	Proposal: Using the combined products of the practice experience in the integrative project (oral presentation, IP paper and PE portfolio). There will be 6 criteria that the students need to demonstrate
	within those items to essentially pass. These six criteria include:





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	-How racial equity and historical context applies to a student selected public health issue
	-Application of theory to support a public health program, policy or research study
	-Description of implications of a public health program, policy, or issue
	-Clear communication to other public health professionals
	-Demonstration of at least 5 CEPH foundational competencies
	-Demonstration of 4 program competencies
	Students would self-evaluate and then a PE/IP coordinator would evaluate as well.
	shared the student perspective on this proposed replacement. Currently, the CPH exam is impacting the students' mental and emotional well-being from taking it and/or failing the exam. It is also affecting graduation rates. There is data noting that many of the students affected by this exam fall into the 30-30-30 criteria for OHSU especially the race and ethnicity which is impacting our 30-30-30 goal for graduation rates among this population of students.  added that students pay a fee to enroll in the program that covers the CPH exam, so this replacement would also eliminate a student fee.
	This replacement would start with next year's incoming class and be used across all MPH programs. The working group is going to petition the registrars office to let current students who have not passed the CPH exam use the replacement evaluation.
	noted that if there are any students who do want to take the CPH exam, that they are able to take it.
	will be working with program directors over the next year to assist with revamping the assessment process.

	noted that any feedback given may not make it into the document before the new dean arrives, but it may be helpful to have APCC's feedback in writing.	review in the January meeting.
	shared concerns regarding the lack of student input for submitting policies and who is all included in providing feedback. requested that the small groups provide their own feedback on those concerns and any others they may have directly to the document.	
	shared that would like for the process to be easier for faculty, students and staff to submit their suggestions and not requiring a huge packet for submission.	
	shared that small group discussed student involvement in the process. It would be great to have students involved in the proposal development stage and be voting members. To help make sure students have an opportunity to propose a policy, the small group discussed having students bring their policy to SLC and then having SLC submit the proposal.	
	There was discussion regarding the policy proposal process in general in terms of what pathway an individual's proposal would go through (submitting directly to the dean or going through a committee and then having the committee submit the proposal).	
	APCC members also noted the lack of clear examples and general confusion regarding the process.	
	will be putting the comments into a document for the committee to review and discuss in January.	
Open Discussion	shared that the PE/IP Coordinator Sub-Committee has been discussing the pass/no pass for PE. inquired where this mandate came from and if it is changeable.	The PE grading practice will be added to the January agenda.





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	noted the inequity with the current structure as it is recommended that students do it over 2 terms. For the first term, they receive a pass/no pass and for the 2 <sup>nd</sup> term, they receive a letter grade. However, if	
	the student takes it in one term, the four credits are graded.  noted that the PE is for demonstrating competencies, so a letter grade doesn't make much sense. A	
	student is either demonstrating them or they're not.	
	The root of the issue is that PE is a core and required course. All required/core courses require a B- or higher.	
	noted that it is a practice, not a policy. In order to change it, there are multiple details to iron out.	
	will continue to review and this item will be added as a January discussion item.
