<u>Check your voting registration status:</u> Not sure if you are registered to vote? With this resource you can check your registration status in any state.

<u>Voting after a felony conviction:</u> Many people think they cannot vote with a felony conviction, but many states restore voting rights after sentences are completed. This resource can help you determine if you are eligible to vote!

<u>Register to vote in Oregon</u>: If you need to register to vote, and you are an Oregon resident, this website will walk you through it.

Register to vote in Washington: If you need to register to vote, and you are a Washington resident, this website will walk you through it.
