The goal of the Health Management & Policy program is to develop and strengthen the knowledge and practice of the delivery and management of health services. The track prepares individuals for the exercise of competent and effective policy and administrative leadership in the health sector. The Health Management & Policy curriculum includes the core concepts of public health with specific instruction in management, finance, strategy, policy, economics, and ethics.

Program Competencies

Students graduating from the MPH: Health Management and Policy (HMP) program will be able to:

- Demonstrate effective verbal, written and interpersonal communication and messaging skills.
- Demonstrate ethical, social, and cultural competency in the practice of health management and policy.
- Engage with, and integrate the knowledge and experience of other health professions, system stake holders, and communities to address health system challenges.

- Apply theory to practice to design, implement, manage, and evaluate processes to improve organizational performance and health policy.
- Apply policy process knowledge and advocacy techniques to support the development and implementation of policies that advance health.
- Select and apply appropriate theories and qualitative and quantitative methods to analyze, evaluate, and manage health system programs and services.
- Demonstrate professional, collaborative, and ethical leadership skills to address health system management and policy issues.
