The goal of the Health Management & Policy program is to develop and strengthen the knowledge and practice of the delivery and management of health services. The program prepares individuals for the exercise of competent and effective policy and administrative leadership in the health sector. The Health Management & Policy curriculum includes the core concepts of public health with specific instruction in management, finance, strategy, policy, economics, and ethics.

MPH:HMP Program Competencies

Students graduating from the MPH: Health Management and Policy (HMP) program will be able to:

- Demonstrate effective verbal, written and interpersonal communication skills.
- Demonstrate ethical, social, and cultural competency.
- Engage with, and integrate the knowledge and experience of other health professions, stakeholders, and communities.
- Demonstrate critical and self-reflective thinking.
- Apply theory to practice to design, implement, manage, and evaluate organizational performance and health policy.
- Apply policy process knowledge and advocacy techniques to develop and implement policies that advance health.
- Select and apply appropriate methods to analyze, evaluate, and manage health system programs and services.
- Demonstrate professionalism and leadership skills.

Students in the MSW/MPH Health Management and Policy track will complete at least 122 credits, which consists of 69 Social Work Credits and 53 Public Health Credits. Generally, Public Health coursework will count for 9 credits of MSW requirements as follows: BSTA 525 Introduction to Biostatistics (4 credits) will count for the MSW advanced research elective requirement, HSMP Organizational Behavior in Health Service Organization (3 credits) and HSMP Program Evaluation and Management in Health Services (3 credits) will count as 6 MSW elective credits. The 9-credits MSW three-course advanced concentration sequence will count toward MPH elective credits.

MPH Health Management & Policy: Sample Course Schedules

Linked below are recommended course schedules for full-time students, although other schedule configurations are possible. Part-time students should consult with program advisors in both programs to develop a more personalized schedule. Please note that each SPH program has a quarter in which its students are prioritized for registration for certain (required) courses and students in non-prioritized programs will not be allowed to register for off-term prioritized courses until the priority registration period ends, and then, only if seats are available. Registration for open seats is on a first-come, first-served basis. It is important that you register promptly, and that you make every attempt to follow the term-by-term course plans linked out below, when the HMP program has priority for those required courses.

Priority registration is only for a limited period (typically 2 weeks, longer for fall). Once the priority registration period ends, students from other programs may register for the HMP prioritized courses and, similarly, you may register for courses that were prioritized for other programs. While there is some flexibility to take courses in alternate terms, we can only hold space for you during your prioritized registration term, during the priority registration period. If you wait to register until after the priority period, or need to take a course in another term, the SPH cannot guarantee you will be able to register.

Elective courses should be selected in consultation with your Faculty Advisor. Always consult your Faculty Advisor regarding your program of study and course selection to determine the schedule that fits best for you. If you receive federal financial aid, it is important to be aware of associated requirements when planning your schedule. Federal loans require at least half-time enrollment (5 credits). Please refer to PSU's Office of Financial Aid.
