The goal of the Health Management & Policy program is to develop and strengthen the knowledge and practice of the delivery and management of health services. The program prepares individuals for the exercise of competent and effective policy and administrative leadership in the health sector. The Health Management & Policy curriculum includes the core concepts of public health with specific instruction in management, finance, strategy, policy, economics, and ethics.

Per OHSU policy, students have up to 6 years from the date of matriculation to complete their degree.

Program Competencies

Students graduating from the MPH: Health Management and Policy (HMP) program will be able to:

- Demonstrate effective verbal, written and interpersonal communication skills.
- Demonstrate ethical, social, and cultural competency.
- Engage with, and integrate the knowledge and experience of other health professions, stakeholders, and communities.
- Demonstrate critical and self-reflective thinking.
- Apply theory to practice to design, implement, manage, and evaluate organizational performance and health policy.
- Apply policy process knowledge and advocacy techniques to develop and implement policies that advance health.
- Select and apply appropriate methods to analyze, evaluate, and manage health system programs and services.
- Demonstrate professionalism and leadership skills.

Competency-based achievement: Competencies consistent with graduate-level education are achieved through core required courses (22 credits) and program required courses (25-26 credits), and strengthened in specific domains of management, policy, research, and cultural sensitivity through HSMP elective courses (15 credits total). Many HSMP elective courses address more than one domain. One non-HSMP elective (3 credits) may be taken with approval by the faculty advisor. Additional information about planning and selection of elective courses can be found at the end of this guide.

GPA and grade requirements: Minimum overall GPA of 3.0; minimum grade of "B-" in required courses and "C" in elective courses; no more than two grades lower than "B-" can be applied to the degree

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MPH: Health Management & Policy: Sample Course Schedules

Below are recommended course schedules for full-time students, although other schedule configurations are possible. Part-time students should consult with program advisors in both programs to develop a more personalized schedule. Please note that each SPH program has a quarter in which its students are prioritized for registration for certain (required) courses and students in non-prioritized programs will not be allowed to register for off-term prioritized courses until the priority registration period ends, and then, only if seats are available. Registration for open seats is on a first-come, first-served basis. It is important that you register promptly, and that you make every attempt to follow the term-by-term course plans laid out below, when the HMP program has priority for those required courses. The priority courses and terms for HMP students are noted in boldface type in the sample schedules below.

Priority registration is only for a limited period (typically 2 weeks, longer for fall). Once the priority registration period ends, students from other programs may register for the HMP prioritized courses and, similarly, you may register for courses that were prioritized for other programs. While there is some flexibility to take courses in alternate terms, we can only hold space for you during your prioritized registration term, during the priority registration period. If you wait to register until after the priority period, or need to take a course in another term, the SPH cannot guarantee you will be able to register.

If you receive federal financial aid, it is important to be aware of financial aid requirements when planning your schedule. Federal loan programs require at least 1/2 time enrollment (5 credits). Please refer to OHSU's <u>Financial Aid Explained</u> and the <u>Standard Enrollment Plan</u>, paying particular attention to summer term. Dual degree students should consult PSU's Office of Financial Aid.

MSW/MPH: Health Management & Policy (Dual Degree) Course Plan: MPH HMP/MSW dual degree students should contact their Faculty Advisor(s) for MSW program requirements, course availability and scheduling needs. Because course scheduling may vary from year to year and other overall schedule configurations are possible, this course plan may be re-sequenced. Please check with your advisor to determine the year's schedule.

MD/MPH: Health Management & Policy (Dual Degree) Course Plan: MD/MPH HMP dual degree students should contact their MD/MPH Program Director/Faculty Advisor for MD program requirements, course availability and scheduling needs. Because course scheduling may vary from year to year and other overall schedule configurations are possible, this course plan may be re-sequenced. Please check with your MD/MPH Program Director or the HMP Program Director to determine the year's schedule.
