Overview

The MPH in Epidemiology prepares students to apply contemporary analytic methods to pressing public health challenges, with a particular emphasis on health equity, justice, and the social and structural forces that shape population health. Students develop skills in epidemiologic study design, critical evidence appraisal, and data analysis while learning to communicate findings meaningfully to diverse audiences and to collaborate to advance community and public health priorities. Graduates are prepared for careers in public health research, government and community health agencies, health systems, as well as for continued doctoral training.

Per OHSU policy, students have up to 6 years from the date of matriculation to complete their degree.

Program Competencies

1. Conduct epidemiologic analyses using contemporary analytic methods to address complex public health challenges
2. Co-design projects that advance community and public health priorities using methodologically sound analytic approaches
3. Integrate equity-focused frameworks and systems thinking into epidemiologic study design, analysis, and interpretation to promote justice in public health outcomes
4. Communicate epidemiologic findings effectively to diverse audiences
5. Synthesize literature and varied data sources to identify gaps, biases, and opportunities for understanding population health trends, inequities, and improvement strategies.

Competency-based achievement: Competencies consistent with graduate-level education (56 credits total) are achieved through core required courses, program required courses, and strengthened through elective courses, applied practice and integrative learning experiences, and an interprofessional requirement. Additional information about planning and selection of elective courses can be found at the end of this guide.

GPA and grade requirements: Minimum overall GPA of 3.0; minimum grade of “B-” in required courses and “C” in elective courses; no more than two grades lower than “B-” can be applied to the degree. MPH Epidemiology Recommended Course Sequencing

Below are recommended course schedules for full and part-time students. Although other schedules are possible, you should try to adhere to the recommended sequence as much as possible; this assists in resource allocations at the level of the school. Be sure to consult with your Faculty Advisor regarding your program of study to choose the best electives for your educational and professional goals.

In a given term, CPH prefix courses as well as the asynchronous versions of PUBH will first prioritize the registration needs of students in the online Public Health Practice program, however, student in the MPH Epidemiology program will be able to register for these courses if space remains once priority registration lifts.

The program director holds quarterly group advising sessions that are an excellent opportunity to hear program updates, reminders on recommended course sequence, and to get answers to your emerging questions. In addition, your Faculty Advisor is an important resource. We recommend consulting with your Faculty Advisor quarterly regarding your program of study and course selection to determine the schedule that fits best for you.

If you receive federal financial aid, it is important to be aware of financial aid requirements when planning your schedule. Federal loans require at least 1/2-time enrollment (5 credits). Please refer to the OHSU's "Student Financial Aid Explained" and "Standard Enrollment Plan" documents, paying particular attention to summer term, for more information.
